Rising out of the grassy fields, the iconic gable roof forms reminisce of an early Icelandic rural settlement. Through the summer months, the cabins blend into the surrounding environment with vegetation growing up the walls, following vertical charred-wood slats up and over the roof. As the snow begins to fall, striking black silhouettes are revealed against a white landscape. A sliding wall on the north elevation reveals uninterrupted views of the dynamic night sky.

The simple and efficient floor plan comfortably sleeps 2-4 travelers and their accompanying baggage within each cabin. Adjoining two cabins end-to-end and removing one water closet effectively doubles the size to accommodate a larger group. Light-weight, modular construction allows the cabins to be easily transported and assembled on-site as required. Each structure is designed so the length of all components can be contained within the confines of a flatbed truck for transportation.
